The Alice M. Ditson Fund was established at Columbia University in 1940 to aid and encourage the performance, publication, and recording of music composed by citizens and residents of the United States. The first Ditson Grant was awarded to Bela Bartók, the second made possible the production of Belajamia Britten if sirst opers, Paul Buryon. During the past half-century, the fund has, among other things, established two new music imprints at Columbia University Press, aided in the creation and funding of two specialized record companies (ARS and CRI), granted annually the Ditson's Conductor's Award to those who have consistently championed-their compatriots' music; and funded chamber, orchestral, and operatic works by American composers.

Funding from Meet The Composer, Inc. is provided with support from the National Endowment for the Arts, The Chase Manhattan Bank, and the New York State Council on the Arts.
