Since 1988, the Contemporary Chamber Players has commissioned and premiered nearly 100 works, including those by Pullitzer Prize winners Wayne Peterson and Meinda Wagner, and MacArthur Fellowship winner Ralph Shaper. Composers selected for commissioning represent a wide range of styles, geographical locations, and ages, from talented young composers to selabilished missters.

Composers have high praise for the concerts. Lee Hyla says, "The performers were first-rate, well-prepared, and committed...it is always good—and unfortunately rare—to hear clear and comfortable performances."

#### Stony Brook Contemporary Players

The Story Brook Contemporary Chamber Players was directed for many years by piants (Blitert Kallahs and percussionist Raymond Des Roches, both members of the Department of Music and both noted performers of recent music.
