## 1980 Census/EEO Special File

This introduction provides background and explanatory material regarding data found in this booklet. Please read this section carefully to ensure your understanding of these data.

### Data Source/Tabulation of Hispanics

Data in the tables are from the 1980 Census EEO Special File prepared by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census. The File contains civilian labor force data by race and sex for 514 occupational categories which consist of 503 detailed occupations, 10 subcategories for four of these occupations, and a count of persons unemployed since 1975. The File contains data for geographical units including places with population over 50,000, counties, standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSAs), and states in the United States.

In this booklet the 514 occupational categories are listed in census code order on pages 3 to 14. In the subsequent tables, Hispanics have been excluded from the race categories. That is, counts are provided for Hispanics; White, not Hispanic; Black, not Hispanic; American Indian/Eskimo/Aleut, not Hispanic; Asian/Pacific Islander, not Hispanic; and Other, not Hispanic. The double counting of Hispanics found in other 1980 tabulations is avoided with this method.

### Suppression

As required by law, the Census Bureau suppresses data for very small geographical units that generally have fewer than 30 persons in a race or ethnic group. The Bureau also suppresses another race or ethnic group in order to prevent disclosure by subtraction. For example, if a county had 70 whites, 0 blacks, 25 Hispanics and 5 American Indians, both the Hispanic and American Indian counts might be suppressed. Suppression of data is indicated on all tables by the presence of an asterisk where one would normally expect a number.

### 25 Major Classifications (State, SMSA and National Count Booklets)

The list of 514 occupational categories on pages 3 to 14 indicates the manner in which these categories are grouped to form the 25 major classifications used in some of the subsequent tables. These 25 classifications were carefully constructed by PRI for use in EEO work. Note that 25 of these 514 occupational categories are not assigned to any of the 25 major classifications. However, incumbents in these 25 categories are included in counts of the total civilian labor force.

### 514 Occupational Categories (SMSA and National Count Booklets only)

In addition to the tables for the 25 major classifications, the SMSA Count booklet includes tables containing data for each of the 514 categories described in the Data Source section above. The categories are presented in order by 1980 census code. The National Count booklet also includes separate counts for each of the 514 categories.
