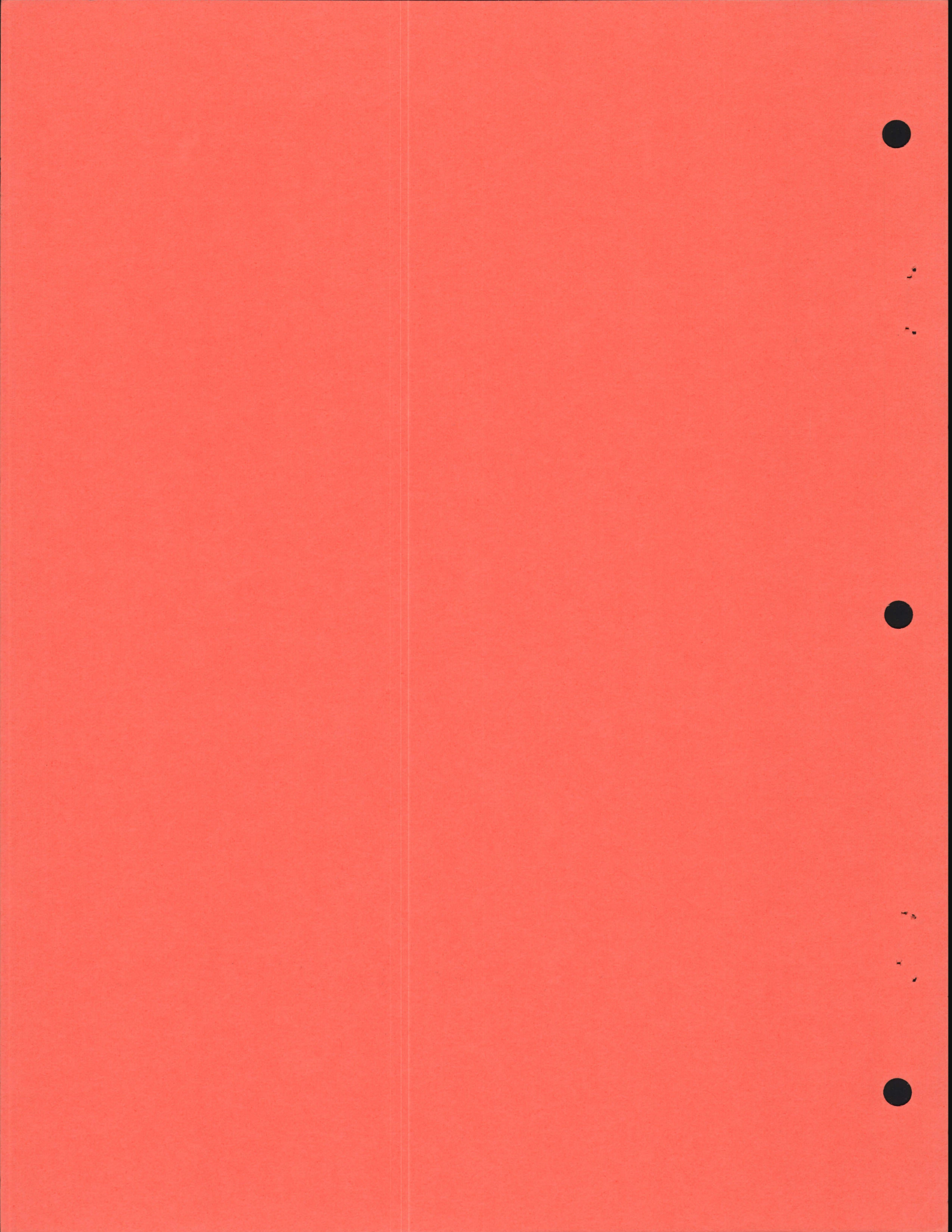

## Introduction

There are vast areas of Nassau and Suffolk Counties that have no governmental identification, since they constitute a portion of the unincorporated area of a town. In many of these areas, the school district takes on added importance, serving as a cohesive element substituting for city or village affiliation. This is one of the reasons for the compilation of census data on a school district basis. Another reason is that all of the 129 school districts in the Bi-County Region must plan for future growth and changes in enrollment patterns. To do so, school officials need to understand the economic and demographic characteristics of their districts. The Census is a primary source of essential information.

When fully developed, school districts other than special or resort districts, usually show less variation in size and characteristics than either towns or villages and thus are desirable sub-areas for purposes of data comparison and the projection of growth. The typical school district is large enough to require one high school, although 10 have more than one and many of the small eastern Long Island districts have none at present (see map at end of report). In addition, school district boundaries change very infrequently except for consolidations or centralizations of smaller districts. When a change does occur,

it is usually a minor adjustment to create a more easily identified line that does not bisect dwelling units.

School District Population, 1970

Appendix Table I, p. 13, presents population estimates for all school districts or portions of districts in each of the thirteen towns. School districts in the cities of Glen Cove and Long Beach have been grouped with those in the adjacent towns of Oyster Bay and Hempstead, respectively. The 1970 figures for each school district were derived from block and enumeration district counts, census tract apportionments, field surveys, and 1970 aerial photographs. Varying degrees of reliability of the 1970 census block counts frequently dictated the use of supplementary sources to arrive at accurate totals. For example, where good house numbering systems exist, such as in the Town of Hempstead, the block counts are good. Other areas, particularly in Suffolk County, have erratic house numbering patterns, no numbers, multiple street names, etc., all of which have produced inaccurate block counts. In such areas, tract statistics or enumeration district data was used in combination with 1970 aerial photographs to permit the apportionment of population into school districts.



## Size of School Districts

Long Island School Districts currently range in size from Brentwood, the largest, with a population of 73,352 persons, down to West Manor, the smallest, with a population of 118. Table I, below, lists the 20 school districts with the greatest population in 1970.

At the present time, the large districts are almost equally numerous in both Nassau and Suffolk Counties. In 1960, most of the large districts were in Nassau.

At the other end of the scale, there are extremely small districts, twenty of which are listed in Table 2, below. All but one of these districts, the Nassau County Hospital District, are located in Suffolk.

## The Next Ten Years

The population of the largest Nassau districts--Massapequa, East Meadow, and Levittown--is expected to remain at or slightly above the present level during the decade of the 'seventies. Other Nassau districts among the top twenty will continue to account for large portions of the county population; however, by the 1980's, the rapid growth of the larger districts, which still have available land for housing, is likely to cause major shifts in the rankings. More of the most populous districts will be in Suffolk than in Nassau. Commack, Lindenhurst, Middle Country, Half Hollow Hills, Northport, South Huntington, Patchogue-Medford, Huntington, Three Village and Connetquot which are all in Suffolk County, and Farmingdale which is in both counties, should be joining Brentwood, Massapequa, East Meadow, and Levittown in the 50,000 and over class. Brentwood will probably increase by another 10,000 persons. Smithtown and Middle Country will probably find themselves with populations in the 70,000 and 60,000 range, respectively. Sachem, in Central Suffolk County, is expected to be the largest district of all with a population count of close to 100,000.

Many of the least populous districts will remain so in the foreseeable future. The exceptions are West, East, and South Manor, which are in the path of development in eastern Brookhaven Town, and South Haven

which is in Central Brookhaven. Wading River, which will merge with Shoreham, is also likely to increase in size. It is possible that further consolidations could still occur which would remove some of these small districts, but many such as Fishers Island, Fire Island, and Shelter Island serve geographically isolated second home areas and probably would not be consolidated.

#### Relation of Census Estimates to 1970 School District Projections

The Comprehensive Plan Series report, Population, published in 1969 and now out of print, contained estimates of the total number of persons residing within each of the school districts. The same report included projections of school district population for the years 1970, 1975, 1980, and 1985.

Revision of the projections is scheduled for late 1973, following the completion of the analysis of the 1970 census data. In the interim, the brief evaluation of projected and reported school district counts for 1970 presented below, together with the comparison of the two sets of figures provided in Appendix Table 2, should enable school boards and their planning staffs to make reasonably good use of the existing projections for 1975 and 1980.

#### Nassau County

In the Town of Hempstead, with the exception of the Elmont District, all 1970 projections were close to the Census figures. The population in Elmont declined due to a greater than anticipated decrease in the

number of young children residing in the district. A similar drop in the juvenile population seems likely to keep many of the Hempstead Town School District counts slightly below the projected levels. In a few North Hempstead Districts, such as Westbury and Herricks, the projections were more than 1,500 persons above the actual 1970 figures. However, since buildable land still remains in these districts, it is entirely possible that they will reach expected 1975 or 1980 populations. Most of the other districts should reach the 1975 and 1980 projections and then remain relatively stable thereafter as saturation will have occurred, and reductions in household size will tend to compensate for any new housing unit construction. In the Town of Oyster Bay, projections and Census counts were all close and future projections still appear valid.

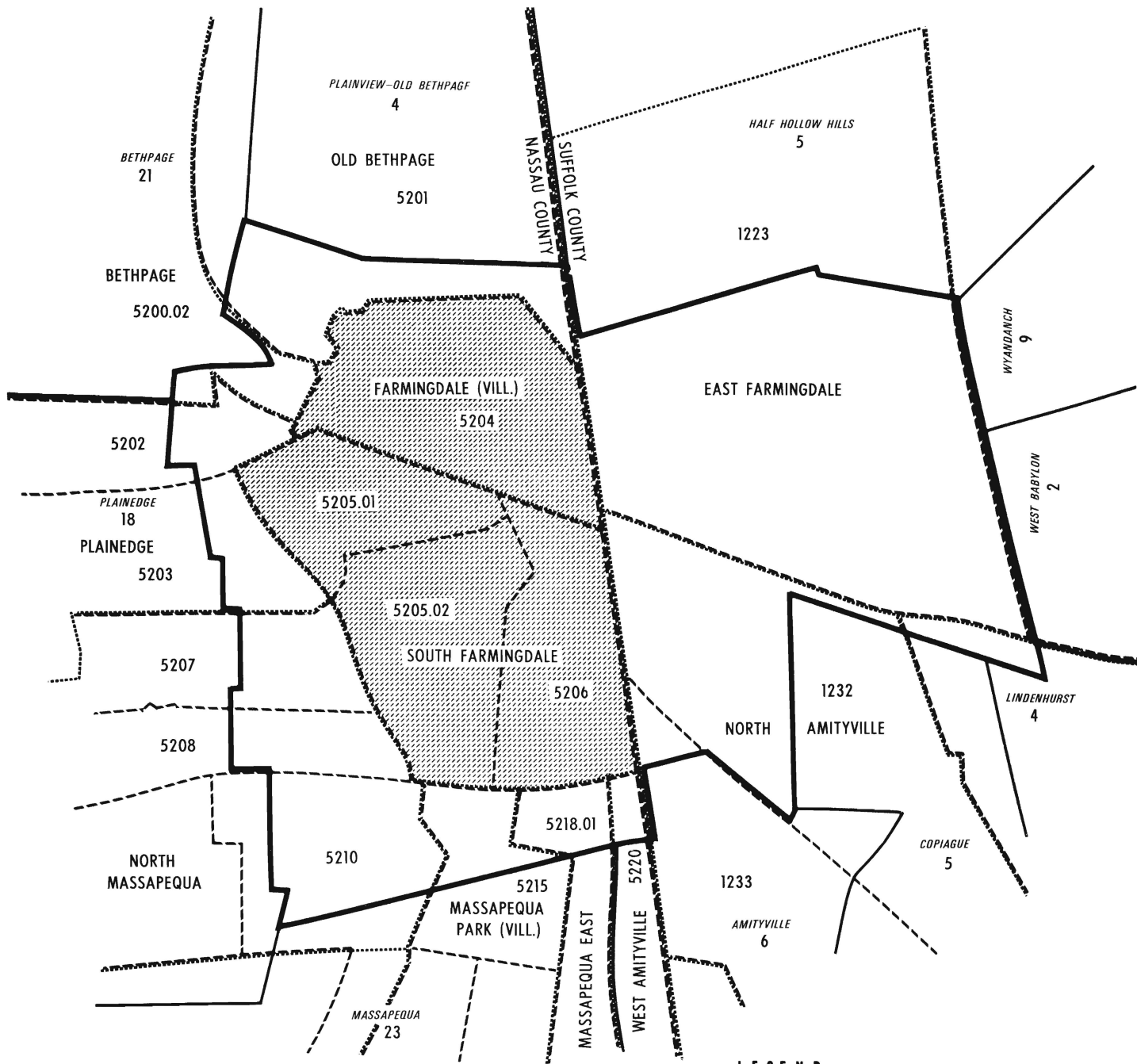
#### Suffolk County

In the Town of Babylon, the projections were fairly close; however, the Amityville and Wyandanch projections were low and the population in those districts has already reached 1975 estimates. In Brookhaven Town, the projections were too low for the Middle Country, Sachem, and Three Village Districts, which has already exceeded the 1975 estimate. The growth of the State University whose resident students are included in the school district figure has been an important and not always predictable factor in the size of the Three Village District. The projections were too high for Mt. Sinai, Shoreham, and Center

Moriches; however, since all three are at the present boundary of the rapidly urbanizing area, succeeding projections still appear valid. Unprecedented growth in the Half Hollow Hills School District in Huntington has resulted in a 1970 count that is a decade ahead of the projected total. In the Town of Islip, projections for three districts--East Islip, Bayport, and Hauppauge--were significantly higher than the actual totals. All still have land available to meet later projections. The Brentwood District count exceeded the projected figures, and because of the large amount of land already available in the form of small lots on existing streets, could continue to experience above average growth over the next decade. In the Town of Smithtown, neither the Kings Park nor the Smithtown portion of the Commack district reached projected totals. Continuing reductions in the number of patients and the size of the resident staff at the State Hospital will necessitate major revision of the projections for the Kings Park District of which it constitutes a part. The Smithtown District has almost reached the 1975 estimate due to rapid construction of single family homes. Most of the projections for districts in the five eastern towns were close to actual counts in absolute numbers. The area is one of usually slow steady growth; however, this could begin to change after 1975.







#### School District - Census Tract Relationship

Inasmuch as there is a continuing demand for population estimates and demographic information for school districts, health department, youth

board, senior citizen, Office of Economic Opportunity, and other service areas, the methodology for developing such estimates and community profiles from Census data is outlined below.

Although some Census information is published for areas as small as a single block and can be utilized for the preparation of population estimates, most of the more useful socio-economic statistics are derived from sample data and are tabulated for larger minor civil divisions and places and census tracts. In many parts of the Region, the census tract is the smallest geographic area for which a full range of information dealing with income, education, ethnic origin, occupation, and industry is available.

The first step in developing population or housing estimates or community profiles involves the identification of each and every piece of census geography or part thereof; that is, every town, village, place, or tract located within the boundaries of the school or other district. Appendix Table III, p. 21, lists the school districts with their census tract equivalents. Chart 1, p. 9, illustrates the relationship between one school district and census tabulation areas. The Farmingdale School District which encompasses portions of both counties provides a typical example of the difficulties encountered in comparing district boundaries to census tracts. Many school district lines do not follow roads, rail lines, or natural features such as waterways, all of which are standard elements used for the delineation of census tract boundaries.



In order to assemble and analyze census data for the Farmingdale District, it is necessary to begin with the tracts that are entirely within the district. These tracts are 5204, which covers the Village of Farmingdale, and 5205.01, 5205.02, and 5206, which when added together make up the unincorporated community of South Farmingdale. Then the remaining tracts, part of which are located within the Farmingdale District, must be reviewed to determine the proportion of the tract and the percentage of the tract totals to be included within the district. Where the area is entirely built up with single family homes, a geographic percentage could be applied. For example, 1/3 of tract 5215 and 2/3 of tract 5210 could be included in the Farmingdale School District. Where there are sizeable areas of non-residential land uses such as occur in tract 5210, 1223, and 1232, a knowledge of housing locations within these tracts is required in order to permit realistic allocations of tract figures.

Once the component areas have been identified, the appropriate census information can be obtained from the summary types, computer print-outs, or published reports and can be summed to provide district totals and to permit analysis.

For those school districts that are homogeneous in character, it is sometimes permissible to employ a short cut. Tracts that are wholly within the district can be used as proxy for the entire district; that is,

the numerical relationships or percentages observed within the representative tract or tracts can be applied to the total district population as listed in Appendix Table I.



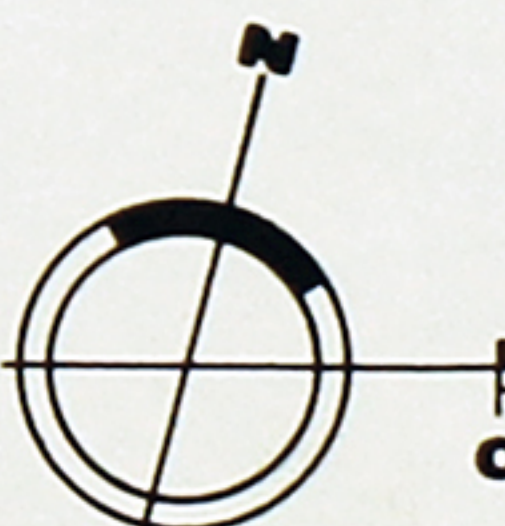
