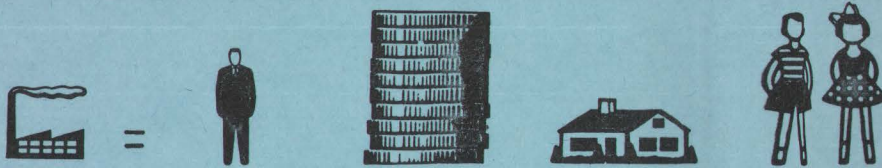


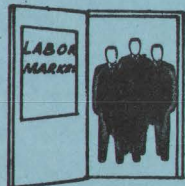

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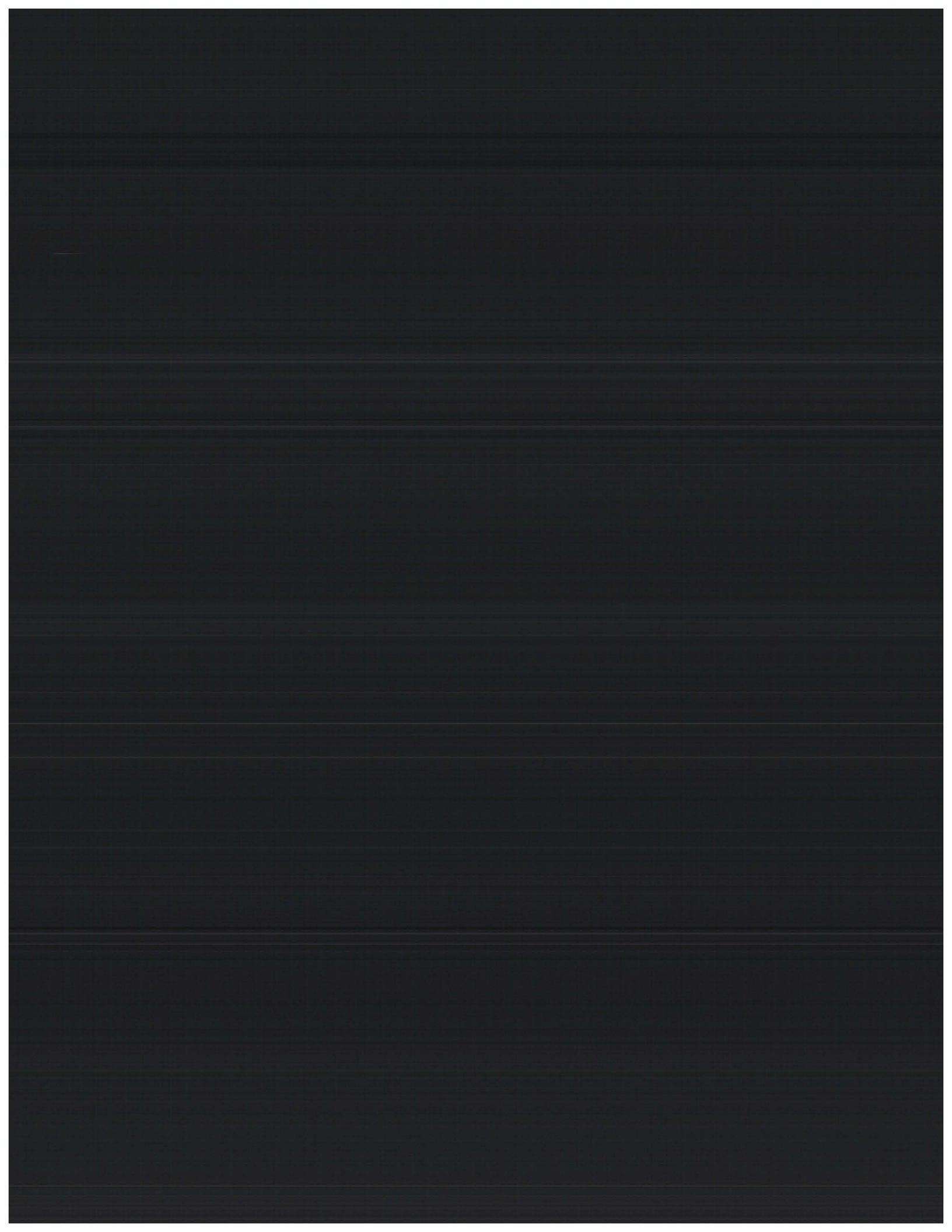
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INTRODUCTION

In the course of filling requests for various economic data, especially those concerned with manufacturing employment, the Nassau County Planning Commission has prepared numerous statistical tables. These include data on defense contract awards, employment trends, a breakdown of where in the County employment is located, and a projection of Nassau's population by age groups from 1960 to 1970. Other general statistics, such as Nassau's past and present population, estimates of vacant industrial land, and a summary of socio-economic data by New York State Office of Transportation Travel Analysis Zones are also provided in this publication.

Some of the highlights include the following:

(1) Large Labor Market Increase

Nassau's population between 1960 and 1970 is expected to grow 16.8%, from 1,300,171 to 1,518,157; during the same period the resident labor force will rise 30.5% from 488,251 to 637,213. (Table A, Chart 1.) The main factor contributing to the high percentage increase in the resident labor force is the projected increase of 20 - 24 year olds. (See Table N, and Chart 1 which compares 20 - 24 year olds in the labor force in 1960 and in 1970 within various segments of the New York Metropolitan Area.) It should be noted that Nassau's increase in this ten-year period is far greater than that of any other segment. Roughly, this increase is also true of those in the 15 - 20 year age category.

(4) Shifting Age Distribution in Nassau County

Changes in the age composition of Nassau's population between 1960 and 1970 are significant, particularly from the standpoint of the chief breadwinner group, which is declining substantially compared with groups of younger as well as older age. This is illustrated in Table P, and Chart 12 showing that the 30-45 age group will represent only 15% of the total Nassau population in 1970 compared with 26% in 1960.

These changes in the population's age profile have serious implications with respect to future County needs for the types of housing, recreation, transportation, education, youth centers and health and welfare services required by each prevailing age group.

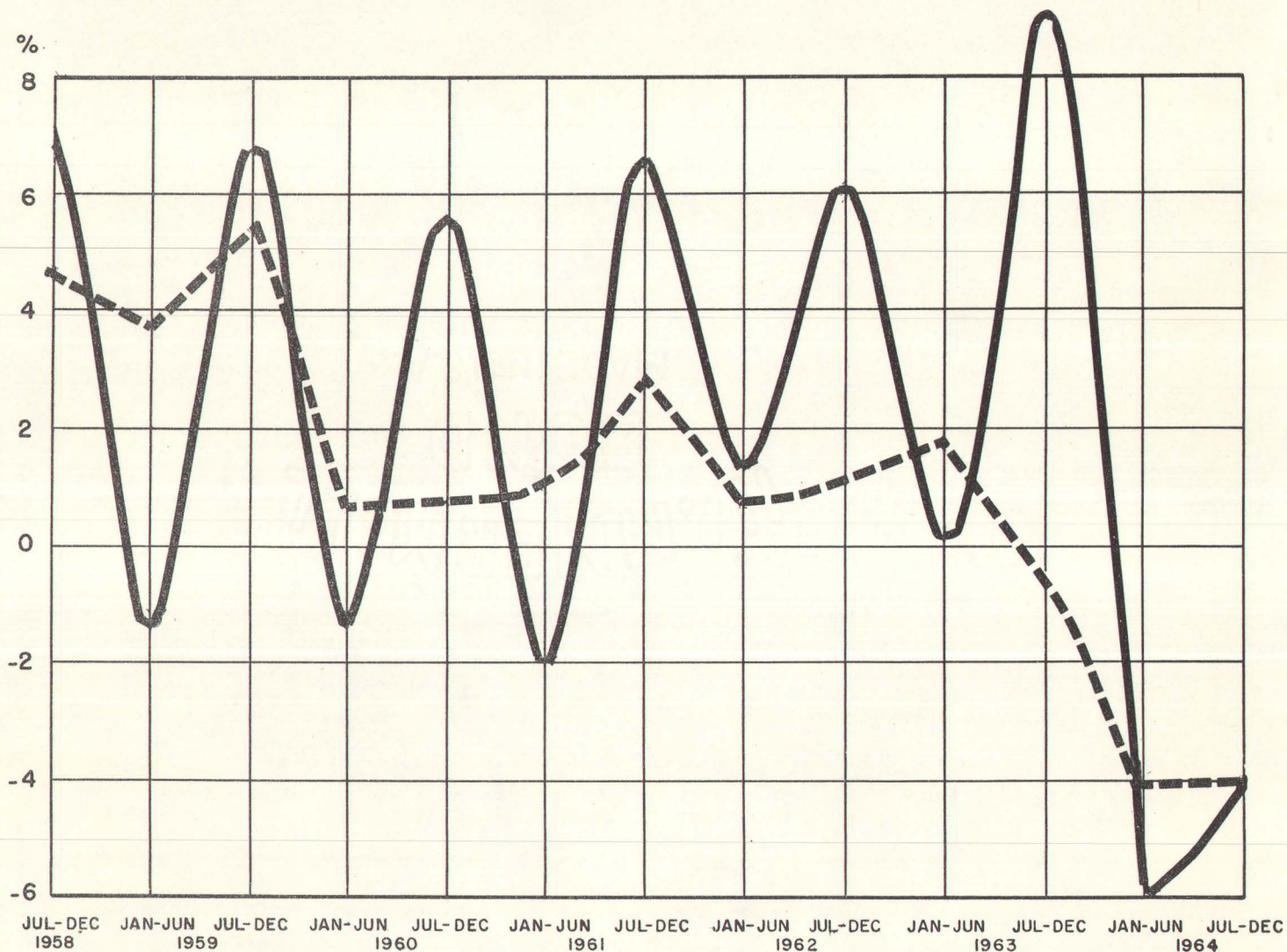

(1957 - 1964) NASSAU-SUFFOLK



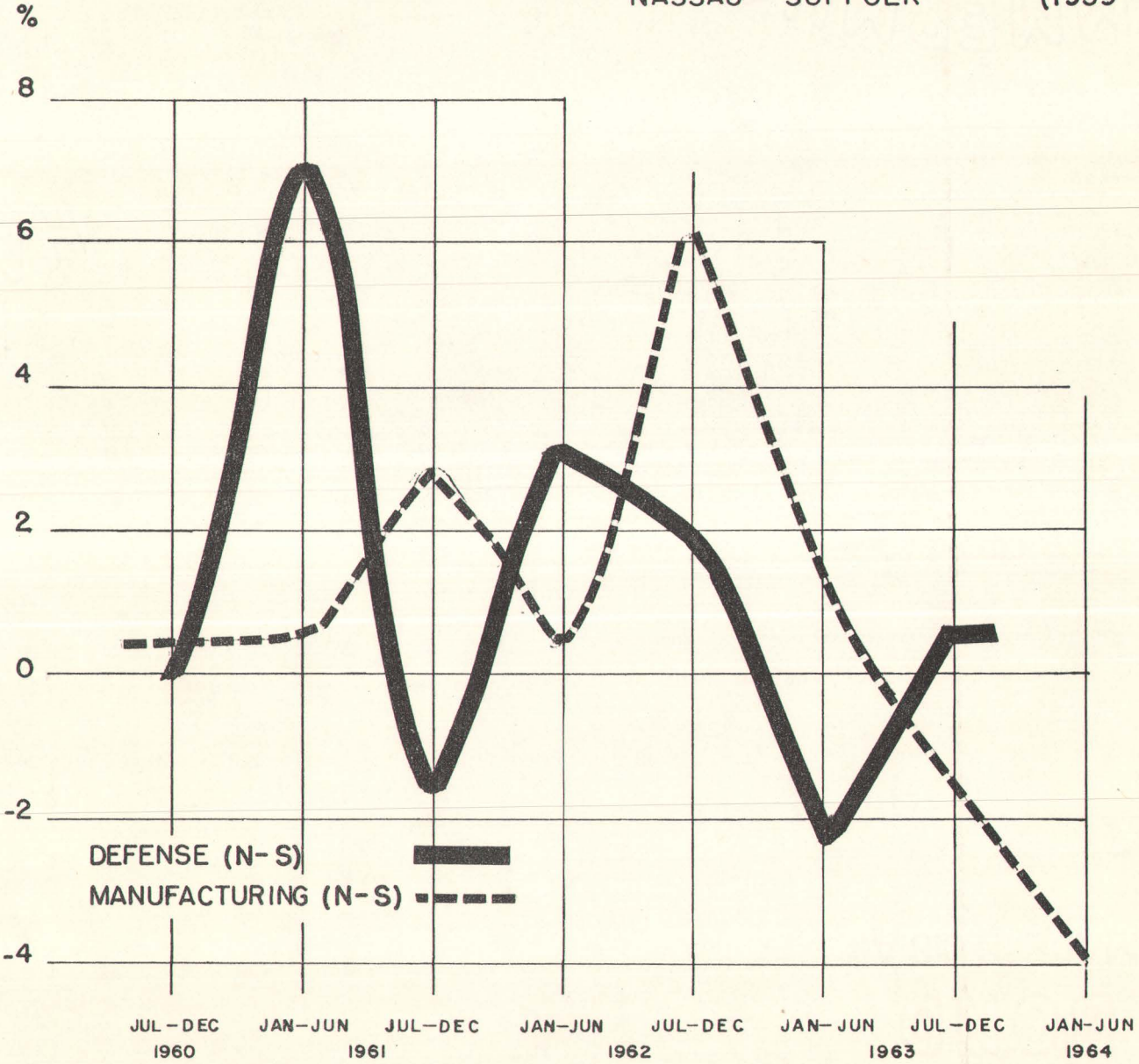

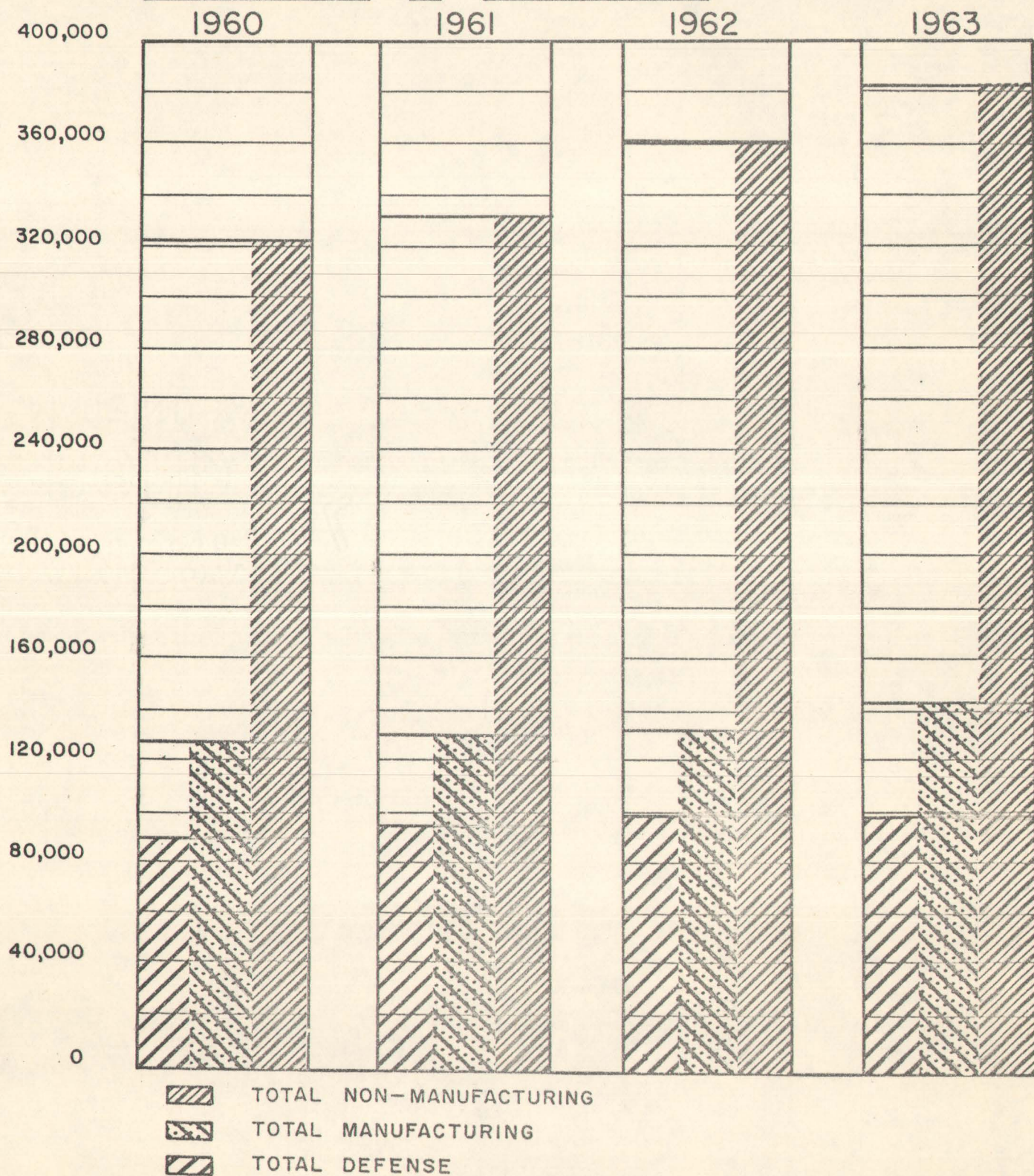

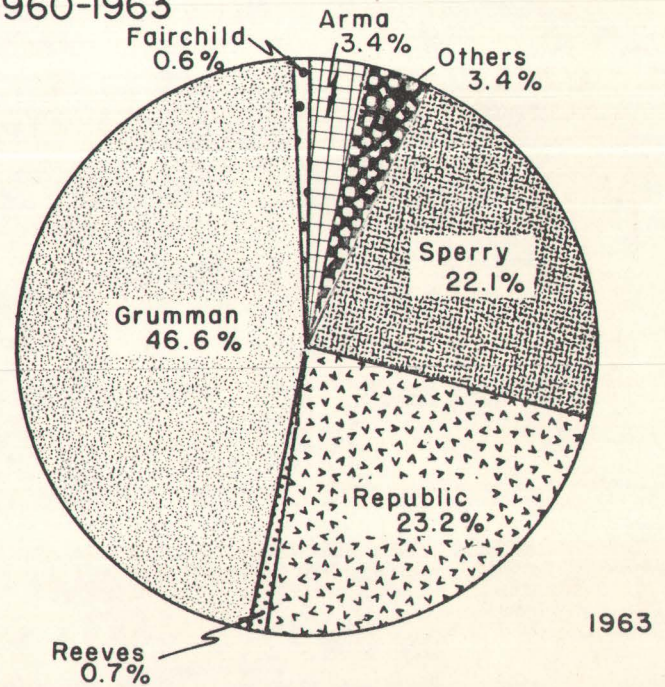

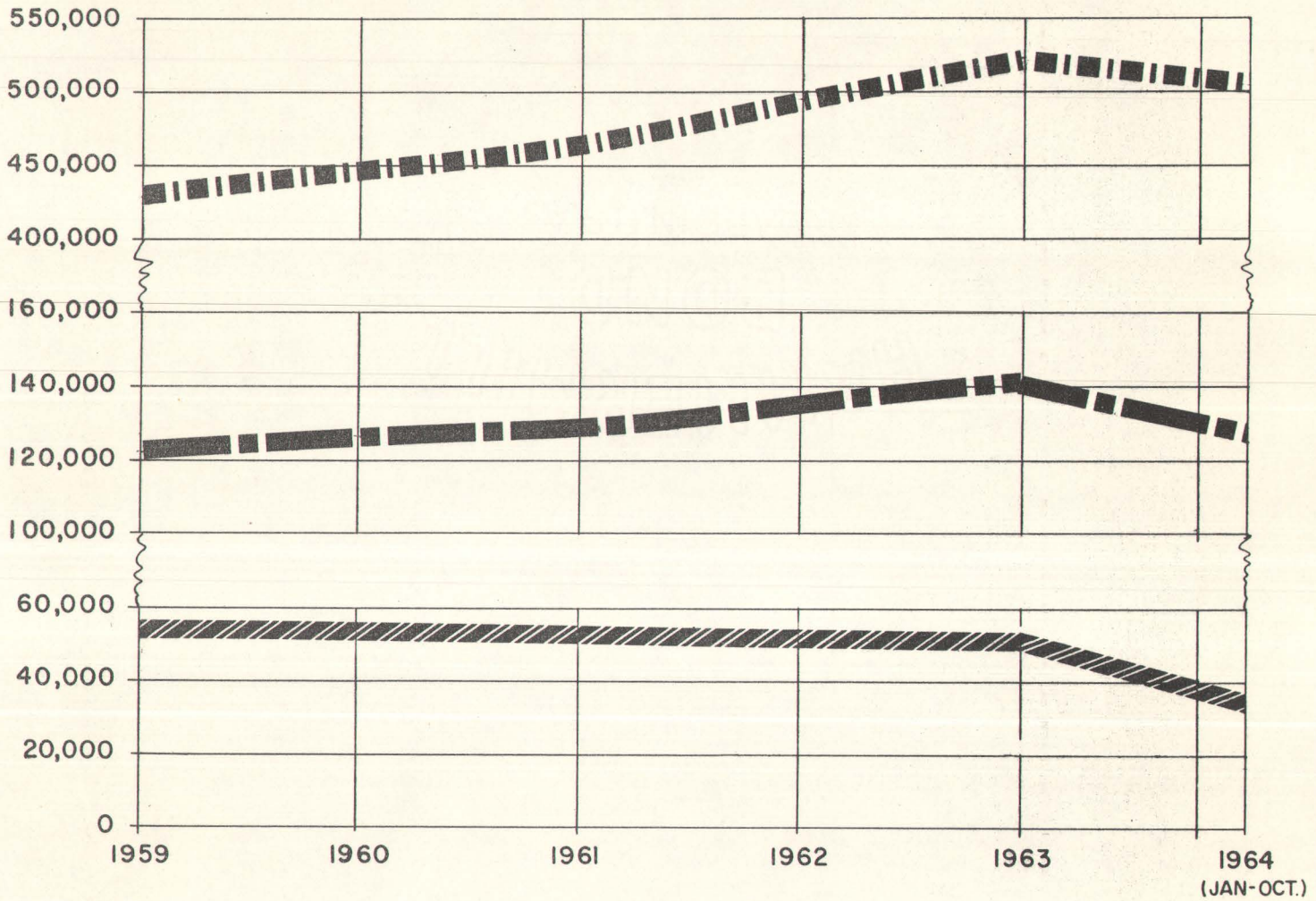

 MAJOR FIRMS

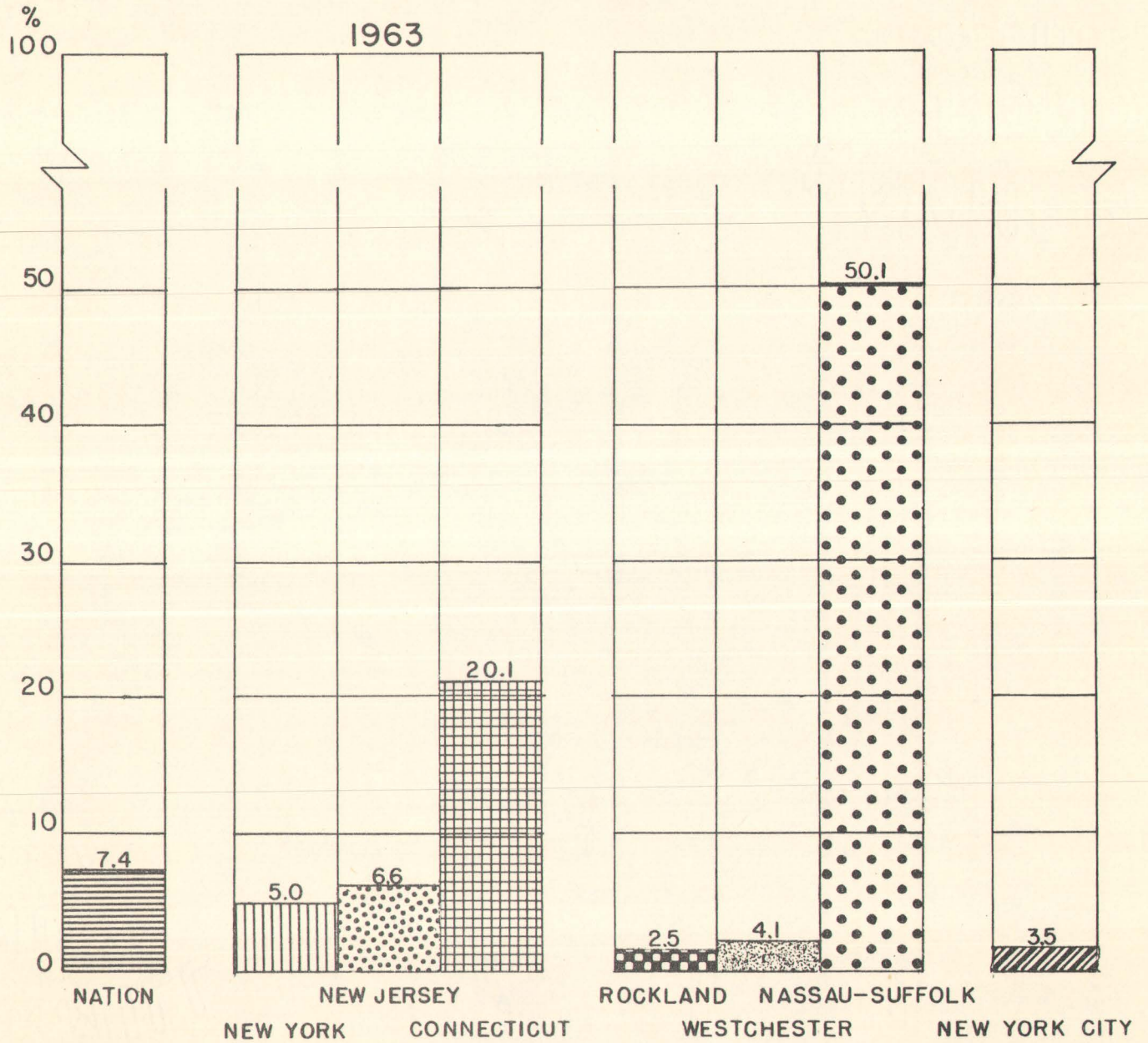

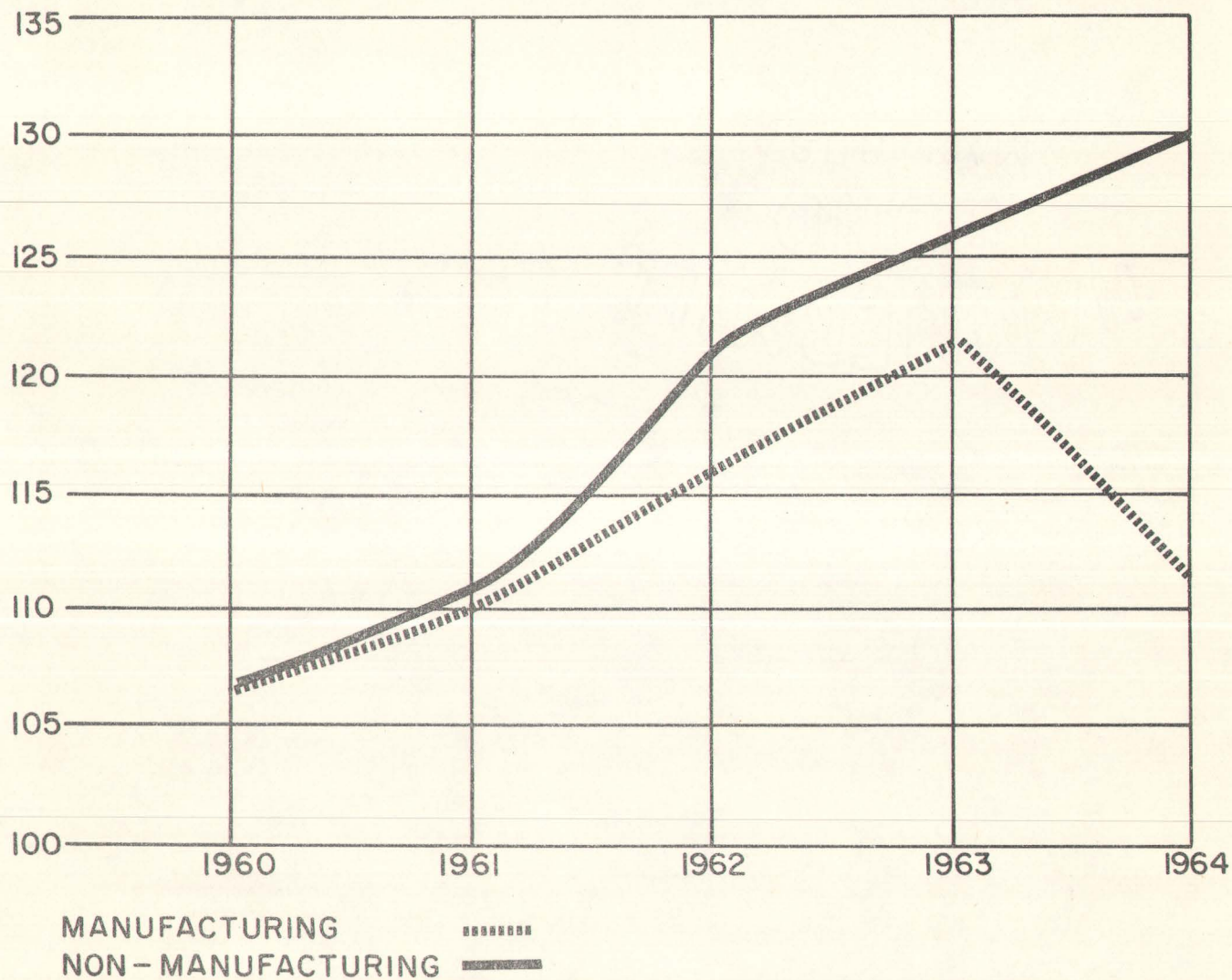

1957-1959 = 100

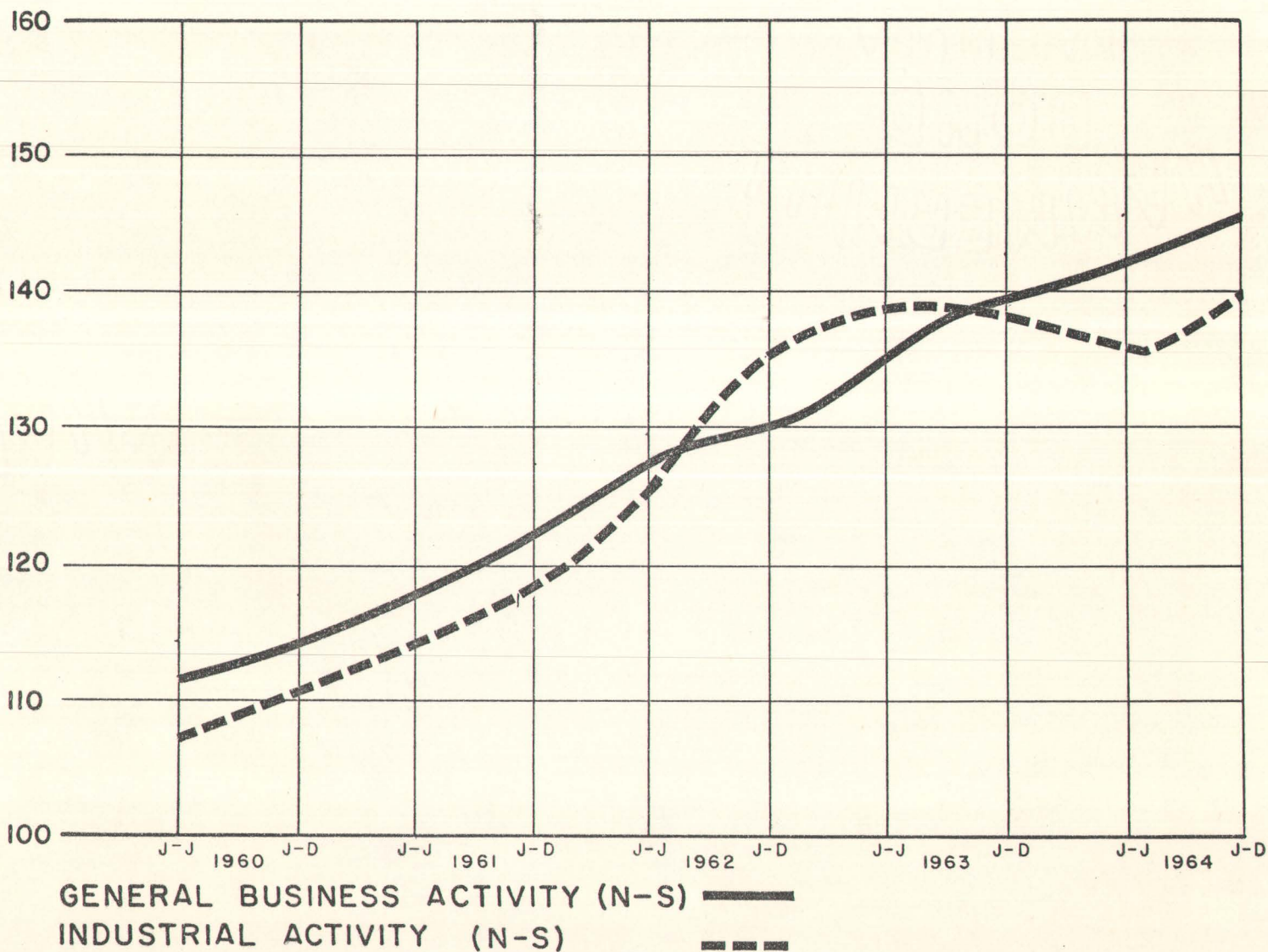

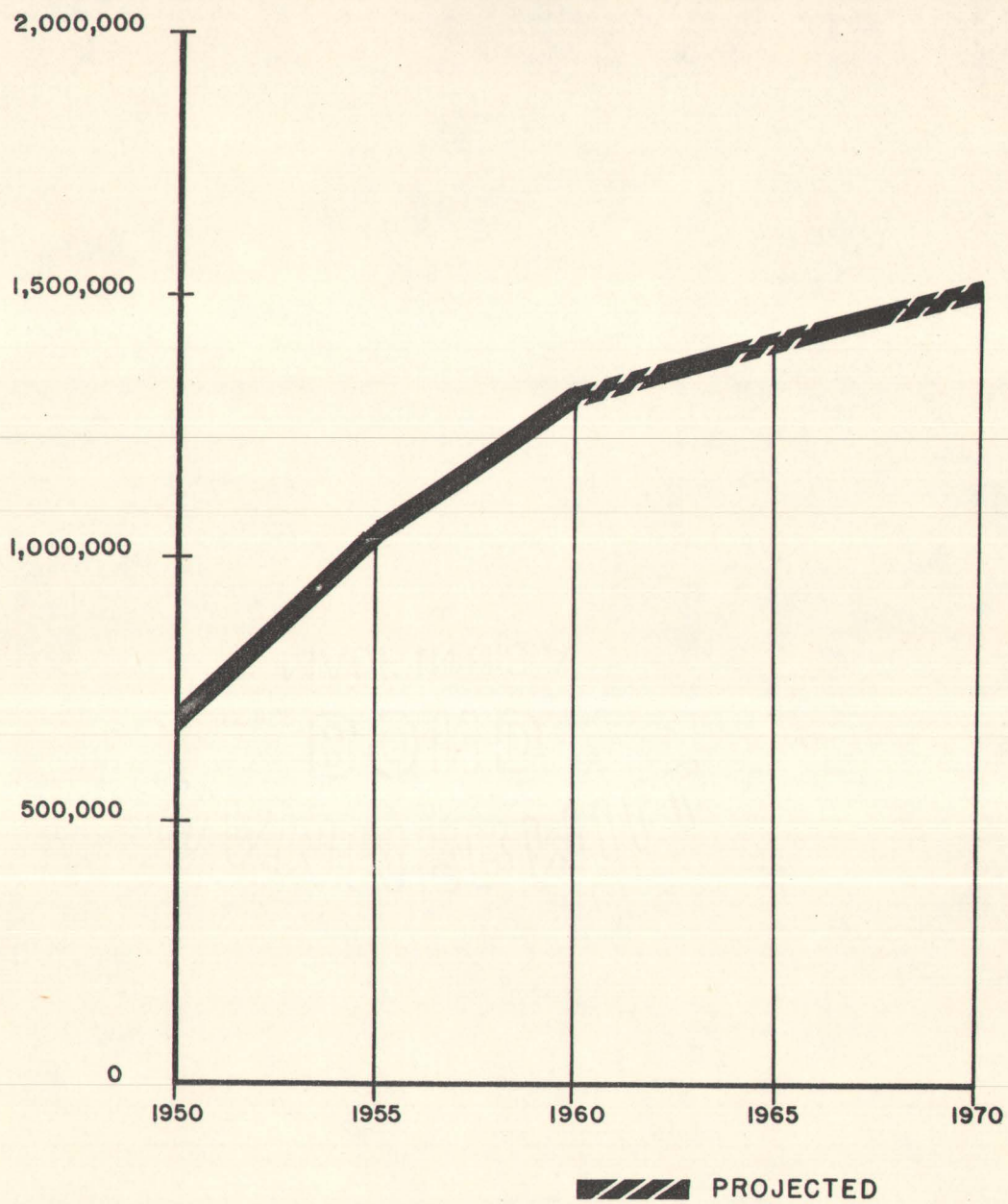

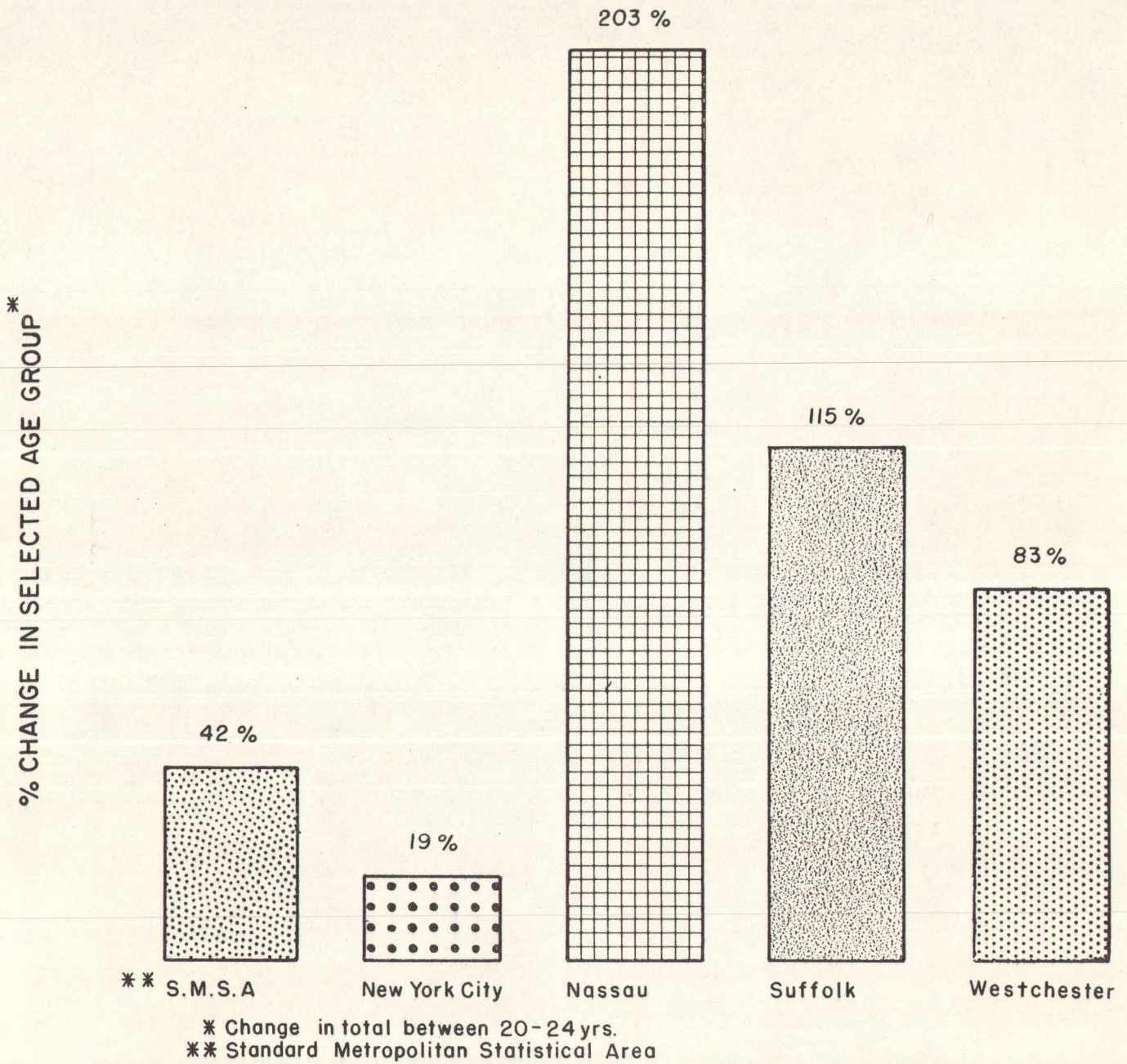

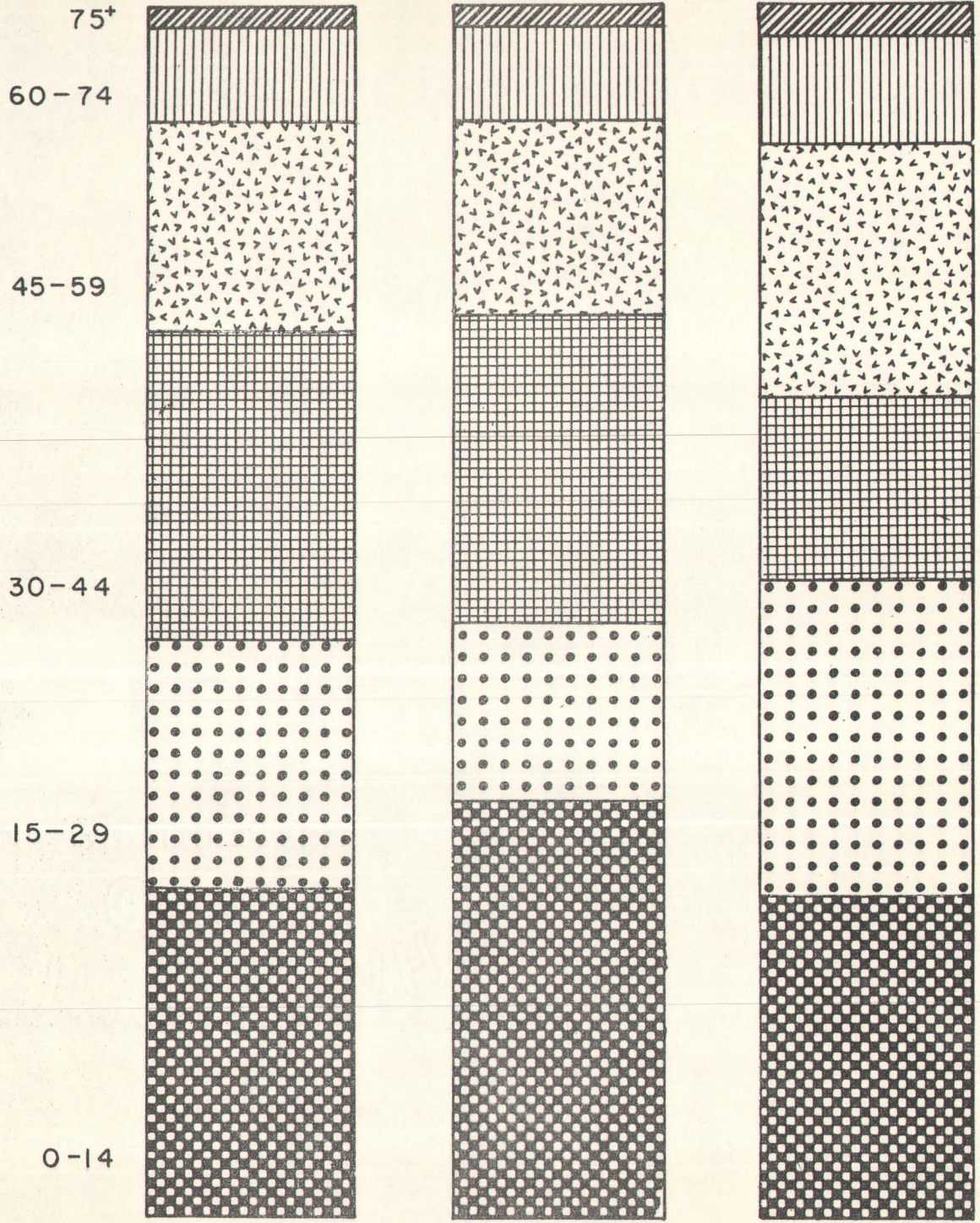

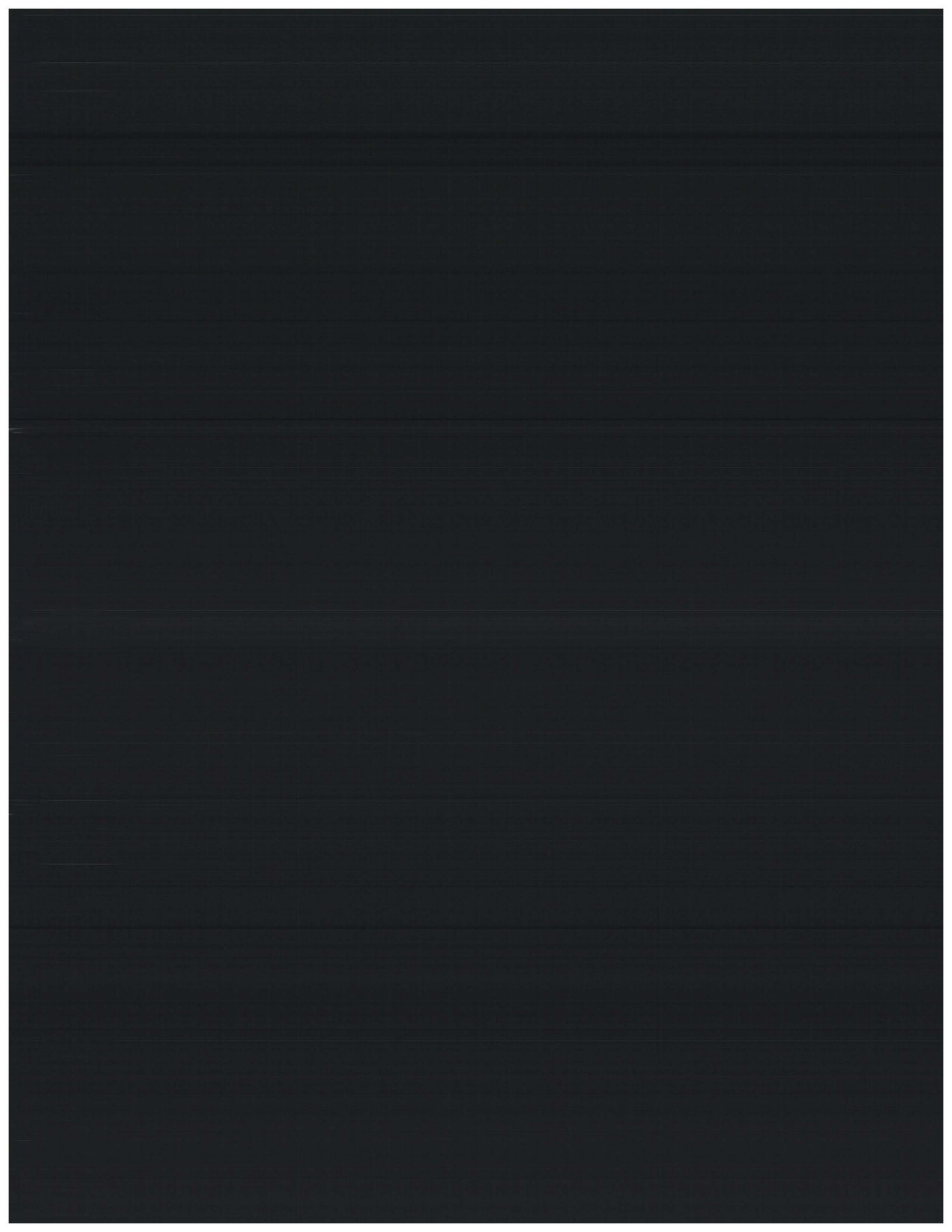
