
Relevance Unusualness

NEWS DRIVERS make information into NEWS Importance (Thishas serious implications) Prominence (Thisinvolvesa famous person) Human interest (This unique or universal experience explores the human condition.) Conflict (Clashes of people, institutions or ideas) Change (For good or ill, the world has changed) Proximity (NIMBY: News in My Back Yard) Timeliness (Anniversaries or holidays or deadlines, the calendar is the crucial context of these stories.) Magnitude (Numbersare the essence of this storyl) Relevance (How wide is the story's important audiconditions) Unusualness (Peculiarity—Man Bites Human DNA










































PIVOT POINT
