
(percent who agree with this statement)

Bias: A predisposition that distorts your ability to fairly weigh the evidence and prevents you from reaching a fair or accurate judgment.

How to Spot Bias

- Look for evidence of a <u>pattern</u> of unfairness over time
- Compare a variety of news outlets especially to search for a bias by omission
- Take note of the self-interest of those alleging bias

Common Flaws in "Bias" Claims:

"The news media is biased." (Generalizations are, generally, unprovable.⁽⁽ⁱ⁾)

"Editorials determine the angle taken by print reporters." (Reporting routinely contradicts editorial page assertions.)

"TV reporters follow the lead of the talk show hosts on their network." (Reporting routinely contradicts talk show assertions.)

"It's astounding the White House cannot distinguish between news and opinion programming," Clemer said. "It seems self-serving on their part."

As for Durin's complaint about Fox News' coverage of the Obama campaign, a study by the Pew Research Center showed that 40 percent of Fox News stores on Obama in the last six weeks of the campaign were negative: Similarly, 40 percent of Fox News' stores on Obama's Republican opponent. Sen. John McCain, were negative.


