10. Rate your opinion of the following statement: "It is important to keep up with the news every day."



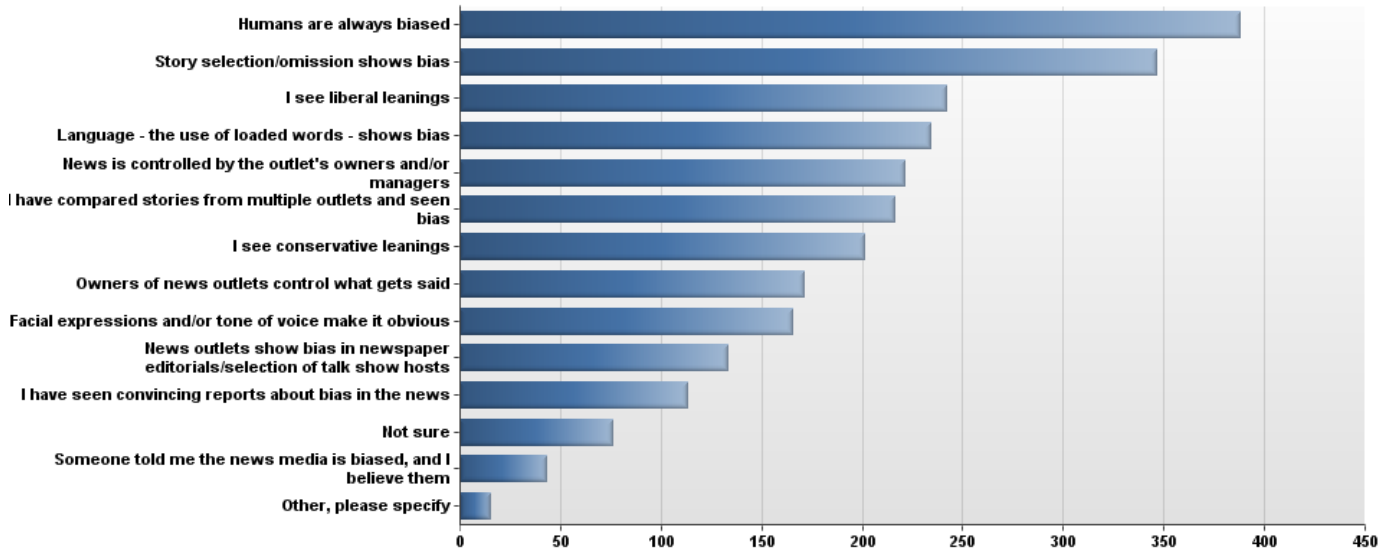
